Below is a few simple ways you can support your child's learning in each subject.

<p style="text-align: center;">English</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Become familiar with their targets and work with them on these. - Ensure they always have a reading book on the go. - Listen to them read and discuss their reading. - Encourage them to use spelling strategies and write using cursive handwriting. - Attend plays as a family. 	<p style="text-align: center;">Mathematics</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Become familiar with their times table targets and work with them on these. - Involve them in useful life skills that use maths such as shopping and cooking. - Allow them to use the methods of calculation that they are confident and happy with. 	<p style="text-align: center;">Science</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Discuss everyday science at home such as changes of state (evaporation, melting). - Involve them in gardening & sustainable projects such as composting and recycling. - Visit science exhibitions/museums as a family.
<p style="text-align: center;">Topic</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Encourage them to look out for information on TV and in newspapers linked to their topics. - Discuss historical events. - Encourage discussion with older family members about history and geography. - Visit museums and interesting landmarks as a family. 	<p style="text-align: center;">RE, citizenship and philosophy</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Encourage and praise tolerance and acceptance of difference. - Encourage them to be good citizens. - Have discussions about 'deeper' and 'bigger' ideas. <p>Try : http://www.thunks.co.uk/</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">French</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - If you speak French, reinforce what they have learned at school. - If you do not, encourage them to teach you what they have learned each week. - Encourage them to use 'Languagenut' to practise their pronunciation and recognition of words.
<p style="text-align: center;">Computing</p> <p>(This doesn't usually need much encouragement!)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Ensure safe use of the internet. - Assist with effective internet searches. - Remind them that not everything on the internet can be trusted. - Encourage multimedia projects such as stop-animation. 	<p style="text-align: center;">Physical Education</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Encourage them to remember their PE kit on PE days. - Encourage involvement in physical activity. - Encourage and praise sportsmanship and fair play. - Attend sporting events as a family. 	<p style="text-align: center;">Music</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - If they play an instrument encourage them to practise. - Encourage them to listen to different genres from different eras. - Attend concerts, recitals and musicals as a family.

Year 5 assessments

Each term, there will be an assessment week. The aim of this is to begin to prepare children for the type of tests that they will undertake in Year 6. This will involve children beginning to get used to working under timed conditions and also used to the layout of Year 6 tests.

Homework

Pupils in year 5 are required to complete homework. All homework will be set on a Tuesday and will be due in the following Monday. The approximate time spent on tasks should be about 30 mins per piece of homework. Each week the children will be set: reading, spelling, and topic or maths.

Pupil Planners

All Maidenbower Junior School pupils have a pupil planner to assist with learning, progress, communication and organisation. The children **must** have their planner in school every day as they are used by the staff and pupils on a daily basis. Please spend time with your child familiarising yourself with the different sections of the planner. The planner needs to be signed by a parent/carer once a week and any comments regarding homework/targets can be written in if you wish. Your child's teacher will also sign the planner once a week.

Regular parent helpers

If you have a regular weekly, fortnightly or monthly time slot that you are free and would like to come in and help in your child's class, we would be delighted to have you! Please contact your child's class teacher to set this up. If it is to be a regular engagement, you will be required to be DBS checked (this is arranged by the school). Teachers appreciate additional help in any subject at any time. Other subjects in which you may have a particular interest (and it is always useful to have another pair of hands) are art, games and computing.
